EUROPEAN PIONEERS OF THE KIMBERLEY

Follow the trails of the adventurous and the enterprising through the untamed landscapes of Australia's north west.

The vast and uncharted Kimberley has a long history of drawing explorers of great ambition from across the seas. Their efforts in navigating, documenting and overcoming this wild region provide us with the opportunity to discover for ourselves its beauty and wonder.

PHILIP PARKER KING

Born in the Australian territory of Norfolk Island, Philip Parker King was despatched to the coast of the thennamed New Holland on behalf of the British government. He subsequently sailed from Sydney to the Kimberley aboard HMS Mermaid, and over the course of four voyages, circumnavigated several islands, charted gulfs and was the first person of European descent to document the port of Darwin. The King River, which flows into the Cambridge Gulf north of Wyndham, was named after Philip Parker King.

THE DURACKS

Arriving in Australia from Ireland in 1853, the Duracks probably did more to open up the Kimberley than any other pioneering family of their era. Fleeing famine and subjugation in their homeland, they held land in the Kimberley for over 100 years, having eked out humble beginnings on Australia's east coast. Hungry for property, and to establish a secure future, Patrick Durack left New South Wales for the Kimberley, where his family occupied a parcel of land the size of Belgium. Yet his dreams proved unable to withstand the harsh realities of the outback over the long run; successive generations continued to struggle and the last of their properties was sold in 1989. Left with only memories, the Durack's legacy lives on in the writings of his granddaughter Mary Durack.

AN EPIC HISTORY

While these relatively recent endeavours have contributed to our understanding of the Kimberley, this remains a small part of its rich and monumental history; a vast body of knowledge has been faithfully chronicled by its Indigenous custodians, as well as geologists and natural historians.

Recycling

We undertake our own recycling at our exclusive remote Wilderness Lodges, returning all materials to Broome.

Renewable Energy

APT's Bungle Bungle and Mitchell Falls Wilderness Lodges are powered by solar/diesel co-generation power plants to harness the sun's energy and therefore reduce the dependence on fossil fuels.

ABCO Water Systems

This system takes all waste water and processes it to class two water. This water is then surface sprinkled or leached.

Environmentally Friendly Products

Our cleaning products are bought in bulk and decanted into containers that are washed and reused.

Sensitive Building Design

We adopt a building design that is sympathetic to the local environment, including the use of recycled materials for the Ungolan Pavilion at our Mitchell Falls Wilderness Lodge.

SEIZE THE DAY

The Kimberley's climate is a defining characteristic of the region. Depending upon the time of year you choose to visit, the days can be very hot, while the temperature may drop quite rapidly as night sets in – occasionally getting into single digits. Our itineraries are planned so that you will be able to take advantage of early morning walks, with the evening left free for you to enjoy magical sunsets.

GO THE DISTANCE

Due to the remoteness of the Kimberley, daily travel distances will vary. On some days, 500 kilometres of outback scenery may pass by your window before you reach the next destination; while on other days, travel distances will be much less. On unsealed roads, such as the epic Gibb River Road, covering the required distance can take longer. Comfort stops are made roughly every two hours, and more often if required.

TIME FOR A SWIM

Many gorges and rivers wait to be discovered along the way, so you will often have the chance to take a refreshing swim.

KNOW YOUR LIMITS

A good level of fitness and sturdy walking shoes are both essential when undertaking walks in the Kimberley. Most walks are on unpaved paths which do not have hand rails. Conditions are often very hot and the terrain can be rugged, with uneven and occasionally slippery surfaces. Boarding and disembarking Zodiacs also requires basic physical fitness.

of mysterious Bradshaw (Gwion Gwion) paintings, dating back some 20,000 years. These stylised figures give impressions of movement, depicting people involved in ritual dancing, complete with elaborate clothing including tassels hanging from the arms and waist. The style of these paintings is very distinctive. BLD

Day 7. Bigge Island.

(S) Off the coast of the Kimberley, approximately six kilometres from the mainland, lies Bigge Island. Comprising a rugged terrain, featuring multicoloured sandstone, it is home to the northern quoll. Known for its Indigenous rock art created by the Wunambal people, explore the caves throughout the island and see examples of first-contact art, depicting European tall ships dating from the 15th to 18th century. Learn how the mysterious Wandjina figures painted here are unique to the Kimberley. To the Wunambal, the Wandjina is the supreme Creator, as well as a symbol of fertility and rain who comes to the Kimberley every wet season in order to bring life. The Wandjina is unique to the Kimberley and many of the Wandjina art sites are still repainted each year as a tradition which reconnects the Wunambal to their Creator. Having been repainted annually for the past 5,000 years, it is thought to be the oldest continuous sacred painting tradition on the planet. BLD

Day 8. Prince Frederick Harbour, Hunter River, Mitchell Falls. Your expedition ship arrives at Prince Frederick Harbour today, home to towering

red cliffs and mangroves. With its extreme tides and pristine ecosystems, the harbour is home to a wide variety of wildlife, including saltwater crocodiles and mudskippers. For the keen birdwatchers among you, be sure to keep an eye out for kingfishers, egrets, herons and the majestic white-bellied sea eagles. Jump aboard your Zodiac vessels for an exploration of the Hunter River and Naturalist Island. As your day draws to a close, you may choose to set out on a helicopter flight to view Mitchell Falls from above (own expense). BLD

Day 9. Careening Bay,

Prince Regent Reserve, St George's Basin. Reach Careening Bay today, home to the historic Mermaid Boab Tree. It was here, in 1820, that Lieutenant Phillip Parker King used the area's massive tides to beach his damaged ship, the HMS Mermaid, to repair a leak in the ship's hull. King's carpenter then carved the ship's name into a boab tree overlooking the bay. Continue on to Prince Regent Nature Reserve, a protected area only accessible by boat, recognised as a national biodiversity hotspot. Next, it's on to the untouched coastal area of Hanover Bay. From here, you may like to hop aboard your Zodiac for a visit to St George's Basin. If the tide allows, you may catch sight of a saltwater crocodile, among numerous other species of marine life. BLD

Day 10. Montgomery Reef, Doubtful Bay, Raft Point.

(S) Join your Expedition Team for an in-depth exploration of Montgomery Reef by Zodiac. See the reef rise out of the ocean as the tidal waters cascade into the surrounding channels.

Experience the wonder of Horizontal Falls

Keep an eye out for bird life and turtles, then leave this natural phenomenon and cruise Doubtful Bay, a hotspot for whale watching. Later, step ashore at Raft Point to visit an ancient Wandjina rock art site. The Wandjina is known as a living art tradition as these stunning figures are ritually repainted. Scientific estimates show the original depictions date as far back as 5,000 years. When available, you'll be joined by a local Indigenous guide. BLD

Day 11. Talbot Bay, Horizontal Falls.

Today your ship cruises through to Talbot Bay, known for the 12-metre tides which create Horizontal Falls. Subject to tidal conditions, set out on a thrilling ride through the falls aboard a high-powered fast boat. Hold on tight as your boat skims across Talbot bay to the mouth of the falls before making its way through the churning waters. The adventure continues as you jump aboard your Zodiac vessel for an exploration of Cyclone Creek. See dramatic rock formations as you navigate through the creek, accompanied by your Expedition Team member.

Day 12. Buccaneer Archipelago, Adele Island. Today, your ship arrives in the Buccaneer Archipelago, home to more than 800 islands. GLOSSARY

Your guide to understanding the intricacies of an adventure in the Kimberley.

A

ADAPTORS & ELECTRICITY

Our Wilderness Lodges generate their own power. Each lodge can assist in charging items such as cameras in the central dining area. On board both ships voltage is 110V (American standard) and we recommend you bring a two-pin American adaptor for the plug. An additional 220V razor socket is only suitable for low voltage electrical appliances e.g. mobile phones and camera chargers.

BEVERAGES

Most lodges and hotels in the Kimberley are licensed to sell alcohol. They stock a limited range of alcoholic beverages for purchase, allowing you to enjoy an evening drink (for guests over 18 years of age). Guests cannot bring their own alcohol, and alcohol is not permitted in some areas visited. A selection of alcoholic beverages are included at your discretion aboard the MS Island Sky and MS Caledonian Sky.

CLIMATE

May through to September are the best months to travel to the Kimberley, which is why we schedule our tours to depart during this period. The Kimberley region is characterised by both a tropical and monsoonal climate, which can be divided into two seasons – a wet season and a dry season.

The dry season (May to October) will be mild to warm during the day, although temperatures can drop significantly to be very cold at night. The weather tends to be more stable at this time of year so you can expect clear blue skies, light breezes and dry weather most days. From June to August, the days are fine and warm with cold nights (average maximum 29 degrees Celsius). Inland conditions at night can drop to below zero degrees Celsius. Rainfall is rare. We recommend layering clothing in the evenings when travelling during this time of year.

The wet season (November to April) is warm to hot, and humid with spectacular thunderstorms, lightning displays and amazing sunsets. The downpours tend to be brief and dramatic, and the flora flourishes in these months. Most roads are inaccessible at this time.

When cruising, the start of the season is ideal for waterfalls, while late in the season in August and September, whales are likely to be spotted.

CURRENCY

The currency used on board the MS Island Sky and MS Caledonian Sky is the pound sterling (GBP). Settlement of shipboard accounts is accepted with American Express, Visa, MasterCard or cash (GBP).

GENERAL PHYSICAL FITNESS

Our Kimberley tours visit remote areas and feature activities with a degree of difficulty. A good level of fitness is essential for you to undertake walks in hot conditions and over terrain with uneven and slippery surfaces. Some walks will require you to clamber over boulders up to one metre high.

The nature of expedition cruising requires regular embarkation/disembarkation of Zodiacs for shore access, as well as wet landings on remote beaches, where footwear will get wet. Guests must be able to climb ramps and step in and out of smaller vessels. There is a lift on board both vessels which provides access to all decks. Walking frames are not permitted on tour.

It is your responsibility to carry any medication (which may require a cooler bag). Consult your local medical practitioner for any health advice.

INTERNET & WI-FI

In the Kimberley, mobile phone service is extremely limited and only available in major centres. Wi-Fi is available at all of our Wilderness Lodges, and is also available at other resorts/hotels at a cost. Wi-Fi is included on board both ships, however, coverage and speed may vary. Mobile coverage is not available during the cruise due to remote locations.

LAUNDRY

Hand washing facilities are available at each of our Wilderness Lodges (however, washing is not encouraged at Bungle Bungle Wilderness Lodge due to water conservation principles). In larger centres such as Darwin, Kununurra and Broome, hotels feature coinoperated washing machines and dryers. Both ships have laundry facilities available and price lists are available in your suite.

LIBRARY

Our ships have a collection of books and games available for guests to borrow free of charge.

LUGGAGE

As a general rule, airlines permit passengers in economy class to take one piece of luggage that does not exceed 160cm (63 inches), or weigh more than 20kg (44 pounds). We advise you to contact your airline carrier or travel agent for specific information prior to departure, as size and weight limitations may vary.

Due to the size of 4WD vehicles and strict regulations for vehicle weight, there is limited luggage capacity. Please pack your required items into one small bag (no hard suitcases) weighing no more than 16kgs. Alternatively, suitcases are acceptable if they fit within the following dimensions of 66cm length x 35cm width x 32cm height. APT duffle bags are available, enquire for more details. If you have excess luggage, please arrange for it to be stored at your hotel if returning to it post tour or organise for it to be forwarded to the tour's final destination.

Each guest is entitled to take one piece of luggage on your cruise that does not exceed the above specifications.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Travel Insurance is not included in your holiday package. For your protection, we strongly recommend that you purchase comprehensive travel insurance at the time of booking that includes (without limitation) coverage for medical expenses, loss of luggage, cruise and land content, and airfare charges that may occur due to cancellation, disruption, loss of deposit or strikes. Travel insurance is mandatory on all cruises.

VISAS

All passengers are solely responsible for meeting necessary passport and visa entry requirements, and paying all associated costs. Passengers must hold a passport with a minimum of 6 months validity and carry proof of onward or return flights.

British Citizen passport holders must obtain an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) to travel to Australia and a service charge applies.

Please read them carefully as they set out your and our respective rights and obligations. By asking us to confirm your booking, we are entitled to assume that you have had the opportunity to read and have read these booking conditions, that you agree to them and that you agree to them applying to your holiday arrangements that you book with us and which we agree to make, provide or perform (as applicable) as part of our contract with you. References in these booking conditions to your 'holiday package' are references to the tour or cruise package you have booked with APT. References to 'excursions' are references to short trips or tours included or available as part of your holiday package.

BEFORE YOU BOOK

Prices - Deposits - Discounts - Payments

Prices listed in this brochure are valid at the time of publication but are subject to change. They may be varied by advertising or special offers, or changed after the publication date for any reason, including without limitation, to cover changes in government taxes and charges, exchange rate variations, fuel surcharges, airline charges, a force majeure event or other material increases by suppliers. The most up to date pricing may be found on our website – www.aptouring.co.uk. Prices will be confirmed at time of booking and honoured for up to seven days. Once the security deposit is paid the price will be guaranteed

A £400 security deposit per person, per holiday package is required within seven days of booking confirmation. Deposit requirements may vary when booking a special offer. Final payment of the balance of your holiday package price is due 100 days prior to departure unless stated in the terms of a special offer. APT reserves the right to cancel any ticket or booking or, refuse to honour any price or carry any passenger where any payment has not been received by APT within the specified time. All fares and charges are in British pounds. Payment in full is required at time of booking for reservations made less than 100 days before departure. If APT is unable to confirm your reservation, all monies will be refunded.

We reserve the right to cancel the booking if you do not wish to accept the correct price applicable to your holiday package. In such circumstances you will be given the choice of amending your booking to an alternative holiday. Changes in transportation costs, including the cost of fuel dues, taxes or fees chargeable for services such as landing taxes or embarkation or disembarkation fees at ports and airports and exchange rates mean that the price of your travel arrangements may change after you have booked. However, there will be no price change within 30 days of your departure. We will absorb and you will not be charged for any increase equivalent to 2% of the price of your travel arrangements, which excludes insurance premiums and any amendment charges. Choosing Your Holiday

Hotels

In more remote places, hotel standards may not be quite as high as in major centres. APT endeavours to utilise the most suitable accommodation available in each destination to ensure passengers enjoy high levels of cleanliness, comfort and service. If a change is necessary for any reason, APT will endeavour to ensure that alternative accommodation is of an equivalent standard to that shown. Hotel rooms are generally not available for check-in before 3pm and require check-out by 10am.

Twin or Double Rooms

Accommodation in all hotels, regardless of the rating, is in standard rooms based on twin beds or a double bed unless otherwise stated. Share twin match up is not available on tour packages.

Solo Travellers

A limited number of single rooms / suites / cabins may be available on request at the time of booking. Single rooms / suites / cabins are usually smaller than standard twin or double rooms and often only have a single bed.

Passengers Needing Special Assistance

APT welcomes passengers with disabilities or special needs however, please note the following:

1. Any disability or medical condition requiring special attention must be reported to APT at the time of booking including all important information relating to your health, mobility and fitness which may affect your partial or total participation in the cruise or tour. This information is also crucial to allow APT to ensure the tour you have chosen is suitable and meets your needs. Any changes to health, mobility and fitness must also be reported to APT as soon as possible and prior to departure. Where possible APT will make reasonable adjustments to the tour to accommodate your special needs however, it cannot do so if the adjustment required would be unreasonable in all of the circumstances, including if such adjustments would affect your safety and/ or the safety and/or enjoyment of other passengers

2. If you require special assistance or care (such as assistance with dressing or assistance with walking), you must travel with a companion capable of providing the required assistance or care. Please be aware that APT does not provide personal assistance. 4. Please note coaches and minibuses are not equipped with wheelchair ramps. Most river and ocean ships have elevators, however not all APT ships have elevators. Many ships require the use of stairs to go between decks. Further, side by side docking may require passengers to climb and descent stairs to cross over vessels to disembark and embark at times. APT ships often sail through remote areas that do not have convenient docking facilities. In such circumstances it will be necessary for passengers to negotiate temporary gangplanks and uneven surfaces. If the crew decide that it is not safe for a passenger to negotiate such operations they may require passengers to stay on board. Cabin doors and restrooms may not be wide enough to allow access by standard wheelchairs. Wheelchairs and walkers cannot be carried on coaches, due to space limitations. We will not be responsible for any costs associated with cancellation penalties or the return of passengers from a tour, and a refund for lost touring cannot be claimed.

Visa & Passports

All passengers must have a valid passport with a minimum six months validity from the return date. You must consult with the appropriate consulates to ensure any applicable visa for countries visited have been obtained prior to departure. Your Contract

When you make a booking you guarantee that you have the authority to accept and do accept on behalf of your party the terms of these booking conditions. A contract will exist as soon as we issue our confirmation invoice. You will also be provided with an ATOL certificate (see clause Consumer Protection ATOL for more information). This contract is made on the terms of these booking conditions, which are governed by English Law, and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. If your booking is made through a travel agent we will address all communications to that travel agent, who will act as agent for you in regard to all communications from us to you. When you buy a flight-based holiday, all monies you pay to the travel agent are held by the agent on behalf and for the benefit of the Trustees of the Air Travel Trust at all times. This is subject to the agent's obligation to pay it to us for so long as we do not fail. If we fail, any money held at that time by the agent, or subsequently accepted from you by the agent, is and continues to be held on behalf of and for the benefit of the Trustees of the Air Travel Trust without any obligation to pay that money to us. When you buy a holiday not including a flight, all monies you pay to the travel agent are held by him on our behalf at all times. Airfares

Air travel is arranged with independent airlines. APT will arrange air travel a advertised in connection with your holiday package or otherwise arranged with APT. All airfares from London Heathrow are subject to flight and booking class availability. Airfares may be booked and ticketed upon receipt of your deposit to avoid price or tax increases. Flight Changes

Please keep your letter concise and to the point. It is strongly recommended that you communicate any complaint to the supplier of the services as well as to our representative without delay and complete a report form whilst on holiday. If you fail to follow this simple procedure we will have been deprived of the opportunity to investigate and rectify your complaint whilst you were in resort and this may affect your rights under this contract. In the rare event of a dispute which cannot be settled amicably we can also offer you an arbitration scheme for the resolution of disputes arising out of this contract. The scheme is arranged by ABTA and administered independently. The upper limit on claims is £5,000 per person and £25,000 per booking form. The scheme doesn't apply to claims which are solely in respect of physical injury or illness or their consequences. It can however deal with claims which include an element of minor injury or illness subject to a limit of £1,500 on the amount the arbitrator can award per person in respect of this element. Your request for arbitration must be received by ABTA within 18 months of the date of return from holiday. For injury and illness claims, you can request the ABTA Mediation Procedure and we have the option to agree to mediation. Please also see clause Consumer Protection - ABTA. GENERAL INFORMATION

We will not be liable where any failure in the performance of the contract is due to: you; or a third party unconnected with the provision of the travel arrangements and where the failure is unforeseeable or unavoidable: or unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised; or an event which we or our suppliers, even with all due care, could not foresee or forestall. We will only be responsible for what employees do or do not do if they were acting within the course of their employment and we will only be responsible for what agents or suppliers do or do not do if they were at that time carrying out work that we had asked them to do. Please note that it is uwe reconcipient that means that are not that it is your responsibility to show that reasonable care and skill has not been used if you wish to make a claim against us

2. Our suppliers (such as accommodation or transport providers) have their own booking conditions or conditions of carriage and these conditions are binding between you and the supplier Some of these conditions are oblighted and government of the support transport provider's or other supplier's liability to you. In the event that you wish to make a claim or complaint against us, both the services that we have agreed to provide or arrange as part of the contract between you and us and the laws and regulations of the country in which the claim or complaint occurred will be taken into consideration in determining whether or not the services were properly provided. If the services provided comply with local laws and regulations, the services will be treated as having been properly provided, even if the services did not comply with the laws and regulations of the UK, unless the claim or complaint relates to the failure to provide a safety feature which may cause a reasonable holiday maker to refuse the particular arrangements.

7. If you, or any member of your party have a medical condition or disability which may affect your cruise/tour, please tell us before you confirm your cruise/tour booking so we are able to advise as to the suitability of your chosen arrangements. In any event, you must provide us with full details in writing at the time of booking. If we reasonably feel we are unable to properly accommodate particular needs of the person concerned, we reserve the right to decline the booking or ask for the person to be accompanied by a person who is able to provide full assistance to them throughout their cruise/tour.
